 - The college achieved grade 'A' in the Reaccreditation process conducted by NAAC Peer Team on 18th-20th, November, 2010 with 3.01 GPA.
 - Workshops and lectures were organized by different departments to enlighten and enrich the students on relevant fields.
 - The Admission process was transparent and merit-based conforming to the norms set by North Eastern Hill University to which the college is affiliated.
 - Remedial Classes were conducted by different departments to improve the academic performance of students.
 - College sponsored certificate courses were conducted to enrich and supplement the regular courses.
 - Orientation programmes were conducted for new entrants to assess their needs and to inculcate the students into the spirit and philosophy of the college.
 - The Daily Assembly was held at the start of the day. This served as a forum for bringing students together and to imbibe values and principles.
 - Value Education that is aimed at character formation among the students was conducted.
 - The college week under the theme 'Give Wings To Your Dreams ' was held.
 This event provided a platform for the students to showcase their talents and skills.
 - Cells, Committees and Clubs were constituted to serve the needs of the students both in curricular and co-curricular activities with the view to enhance the quality of education in the institution.
 - A research committee was constituted to promote faculty involvement in research projects and publications.
 - The performance of the students at the University Examinations was excellent. The pass percentage recorded is 90% and 39 students achieved distinction.
 - The departments of Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology were awarded financial assistance under the Star College Scheme by the Department of Biotechnology, New Delhi.
