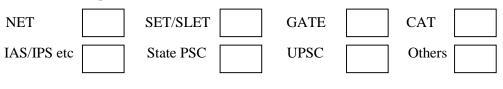

- Orientation program for the 1st Year BA Pass Course students was conducted on the 16th August 2014 in the college auditorium from 9:00 am. to 12:00 noon.
- For the 1st Year BA Philosophy, Sociology and Geography the orientation program was conducted on the 16th August 2014 in the college auditorium from 1:00 pm. to 3:00 pm. Ms. Emma Warjri the counsellor of St. Mary's College was the resource person for the program.
- The orientation program for the 2nd Year B.Sc, B.Sc Home Science, B.Com BCA and BA Honours (English, Education, Geography and Philosophy) degree students was conducted on the 22nd, 23rd and 24th July 2014 in the college auditorium from 9 am. to 2:30 pm. Rev. Fr. Celia was the resource person for the day. The resource person focused more on the issues that young people face in today's world and also equipping the students with good coping mechanisms that aims in helping the students to deal with their issues more effectively.
- On the 22nd of October the orientation program for the 2nd Year BA honours History, Political Science, Khasi and Sociology and also for BA Pass Course was conducted. The program was held in the college auditorium from 9:00 am. to 12:00 noon. Swami Alexander Luthra, International Faculty of the Arts of Living Foundation Bengaluru was the resource person for the day. The program was a successful one. The students found it very effective. He spoke about stress and its effects on the person's mental health. Swami Alexander Luthra also taught the students different techniques to reduce stress and have a stress free mind.
